President's MESSAGE

One Problem at a time

President Duterte finally stepped in and solved the recent leadership row in SBMA between its two leaders. Going back in June of this year, the Chamber – through its board of directors sent a letter to the House of Representatives and the Office of the President asking both to intervene on the issue of SBMA Leadership and appoint only one person for the position of SBMA Chairman and Administrator. The locators simply wanted a reasonable and fair end to the issue and because the very history of the Freeport would prove that the Subic locators can work with any official who is duly appointed by the President as long as his or her policies will not, in any way hinder the normal conduct of businesses inside the Freeport Zone.

The problem was recently solved by the timely appointment of Atty. Wilma “Amy” Eisma as SBMA Chairperson and Administrator. Now, we only have one person driving SBMA, one person to go to for all concerns and one person for accountability. But that’s just one problem solved. We still have other challenges in front of us and new challenges will surely come. We have to remember that problems are not stop signs, they are guides in the road ahead and leadership is not just about problem solving, it is also about keeping communication lines open.

The locators are confident that the new SBMA leader has great plans for the Freeport but these plans are not without any problems and resistance from the stakeholders. The Chamber is here to make sure that the channel of communication between SBMA and the locators will remain open to ensure that all circumstances and instances will be greatly considered in their decision making. Our hope is that the SBMA will face these challenges; one problem at a time, with great and careful consideration of the investors who simply want to do business or continue to do business in Subic Bay. The locators and stakeholders, especially those who have been here for a long time have been witnesses to the arrivals and departures of Chairmen and Administrators over time.

Like the changing of seasons, we have seen leaders come and go. We have experienced many fulfilled promises as well as those which have been broken – whether intentional or not.

The fact that many of us who have been here since the early days of SBMA are still here is living proof that the locators have always been a constant factor in this equation we call the Subic Bay Freeport Zone. Subic locators are resilient, persistent, and hopeful. Also, we are great problem-solvers. But the balance and harmony of Subic Bay as one of the best Freeport in the region doesn’t solely rely on brilliant minds; it also depends on the cooperation between the government and the stakeholders.

The Subic Bay Freeport Chamber of Commerce (SBFCC) and its locator-members are very confident that Atty. Eisma is more than capable of handling the positions given to her by the President and we expect many great things from her term as the head of the SBMA. This immense trust is both a compliment and a heavy burden on Atty. Eisma’s shoulder. Being the Chamber and the voice of the business community of course, we are here to support her endeavours that will improve the business environment of Subic and within the same breadth, we are also here to see that her leadership and policies will be fair to all the stakeholders of the Subic Bay Freeport Zone and to call her attention if ever issues and concerns rise from these policies and directives.

In closing, let me just share a few words from John Foster Dulles Former US Secretary of State who once said:

"The measure of success is not whether you have a tough problem to deal with, but whether it is the same problem you had last year."

We are very hopeful that all the challenges and problems ahead will be solved not only by the new SBMA Chairperson and Administrator but by everyone who is willing to cooperate and lend a helping hand. And of course we will solve them, one problem at a time.

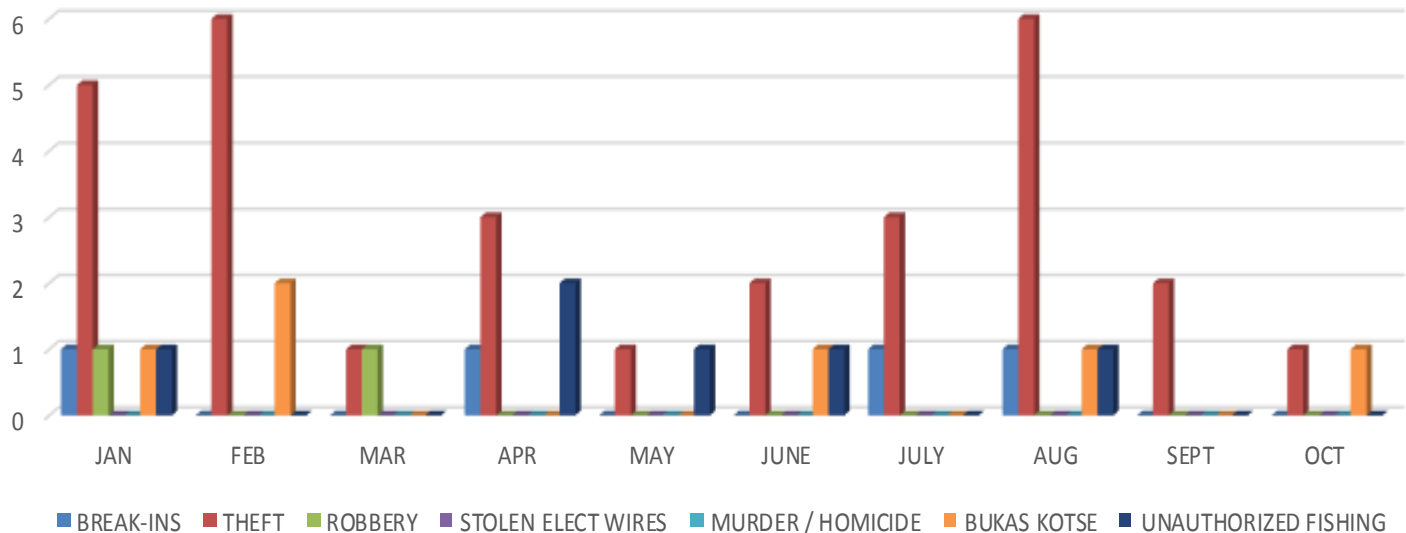

SUBIC BAY FREEPORT ZONE– 91 out of 132 registered participants are declared heroes now by successfully donating blood during the 12th Annual Blood Drive 2017 which happened last Oct. 20, 2017 in Ayala Malls Harbor Point.

Blood Drive 2017 was conducted by The Subic Bay Freeport Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the Philippine Red Cross Olongapo Chapter and Ayala Malls Harbor Point. The SBFCC has been awarded a testimonial plaque in recognition to its outstanding support and invaluable assistance to the Philippine Red Cross. The plaque was given to Miss Rose Baldeo, president of the Subic Bay Freeport Chamber of Commerce.

This yearly event promotes voluntary blood donation without compensation. It aims to raise awareness to individuals that they can save lives by donating blood— and benefit from it as well. The blood donations collected will be made available to the Philippine Red Cross – Olongapo City Chapter since shortages are normally experienced before and during the last quarter of the year before the holidays.

Donors can only donate blood if they are fit to do so. With the help of volunteers from Gordon College and doctors of Philippine Medical Association, participants had health check-up free of cost. Blood donation reduces risks of heart diseases and cancer. It helps to keep the levels of iron in the body in check. It also helps burn calories for about 650 Kcal per donation.

SBMA government employees, officials, and locators were very supportive that has made the event successful. SBFCC COMMITTEE REPORTS

ON LABOR:

SBMA Labor and DOLE Held Seminar on Alternative Dispute Resolution

The Department of Labor and Employment together with the SBMA Labor Center held a one-day seminar on Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) for labor dispute management and settlement within the workplace.

The seminar shed light on alternative means of grievance facilitation which solves labor issues on the level of the Human Resources Department. The ADR and other Grievance Machineries is a possible measure to do away with litigation of labor cases, if the grievance and issue is addressed and resolved. The settlement once executed by the parties will be recognized and adopted by the DOLE/NLRC in the issuance of an order or certification of the resolved issue.

DOLE Issues “Standing Breaks” for Desk workers

After the issuance of the “No Mandatory High-heels” policy, the DOLE issued another Department Order (DO No. 184) requiring employers to provide standing breaks for their workers whose jobs require sitting for long period of time.

The labor department has set and enforce mandatory occupational safety and health standards in all workplaces in order to eliminate health risks related to sedentary work or sitting while working for long hours.

Under the DO, employers are required to provide workers with regular five-minute breaks every two hours from sitting time.

The DOLE said the order shall apply to workers involved in computer, administrative, and clerical works; those working in highly mechanized establishments; those working in the field of transportation, toll booths, information technology and business process management (and BPOs); and all other processes and industries where sedentary work is observed.

The DO, issued on Oct 18, 2017, shall be effective 15 days after its publication in newspapers.

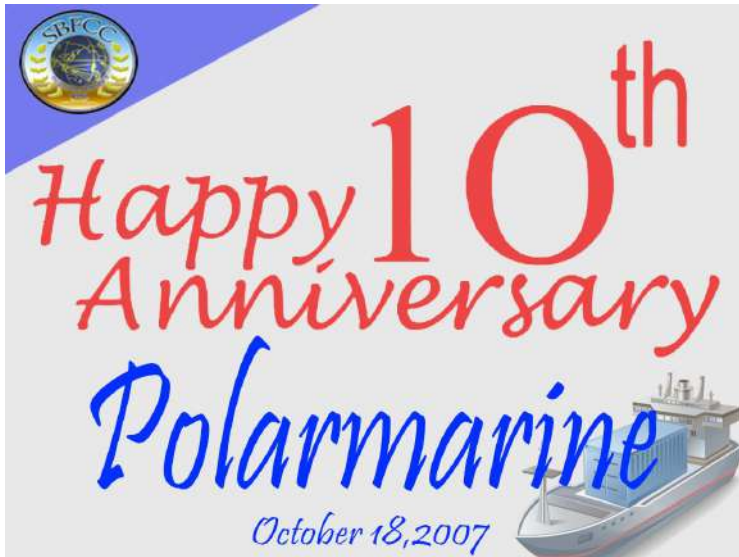

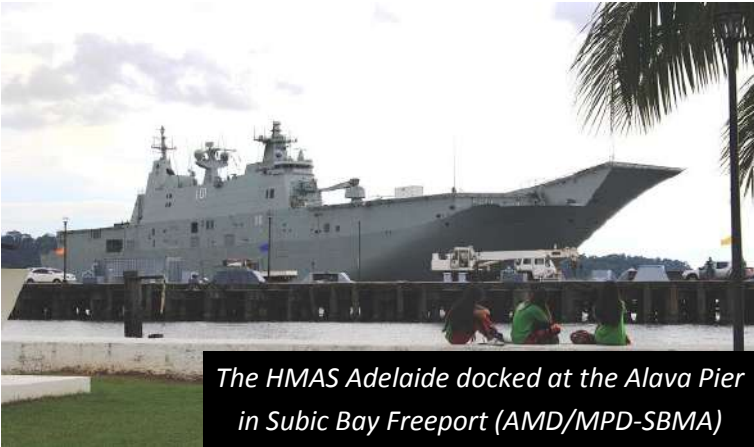

VISITING FORCES AGREEMENT

Australian Royal Navy to Visit PH for Exercises and Goodwill

The two missile frigate of the Royal Australian Navy, HMAS Darwin and HMAS Adelaide visited the Philippines in support of the joint military exercises between the Australian Defense Force (ADF) and the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP).

The two Australian Navy ships called port in Manila on October 10-11,2017 and visited Subic Bay last October 11-15,2017 for an Outreach Program for several beneficiary communities in the area. Training wise, the ADF and the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) has been conducting Anti-terrorist training for Iraq troops since 2015. The joint military exercises with the AFP is focused on anti- Terrorism and Anti-piracy which is slowly growing in the pacific region and in the Southern Philippines.

In November 2016, the Australian government presented several intelligence reports that some of the Australian Nationals who were involved in the mass shooting incidents in Australia received their "Extremist Indoctrinations" in countries like Thailand, Malaysia, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka. Some of them actually made initial contacts with Islamic Radicals in the Philippines before they were converted to Islam and before they were indoctrinated in the extremists' movements. The data showed that the radicalism is fast spreading across countries in the South East Asian Peninsula and to the Pacific countries like Australia which is why the ADF and the RAFF is keen on combating terror and giving trainings to its neighboring countries.

So far, the Australian government has kept its promise to the Philippines by sending actual support troops in Marawi City, deploying reconnaissance planes in the Maute Group strongholds in Mindanao and by giving financial aid for the war-torn areas. The Royal Australian Navy is a regular guest in the port of Subic Bay. *by: SBFCC*

RUSSIAN NAVY VISITS MANILA AND SUBIC DONATES WEAPONS AND EQUIPMENT TO PHL

Three Russian warships, including two anti-submarine vessels, docked in Manila on October 20,2017 and two more additional Russian Navy ships (*Nikolay Vilkov and Frotly Krylev*) docked in Subic bay on October 21,2017 to unload what navy officials said was weaponry and military vehicles donated to the Philippines by the Russian Government as part of new defense relationship.

It is the third port visit this year by Russian warships as part of Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte's moves to engage closely with Moscow. But the visit to Subic bay. it is a historical first because there have never been a Russian Navy vessel in territorial waters of Subic specially during the time when Subic was US Naval Base which played a crucial role in the Vietnam War supported by the former Soviet Union and during the Cold War between Moscow and Washington.

The load included 5,000 assault rifles, a million round of ammunition and 20 army trucks, Russian and Filipino navy officials said.

From the point of view of both countries, this port call is significant contribution indicating friendly ties and relations between two nations in the interest of security and stability in this region.

The visit was timed to coincide with the arrival next week October 28,2017 of Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu, who is attending regional defense meeting, and U.S. counterpart Jim Mattis.

Malacañang appoints Atty. Eisma SBMA Chair and Administrator

SUBIC BAY FREEPORT ZONE— PRESIDENT Rodrigo Duterte on Sept. 25, 2017 appointed SBMA Administrator Wilma T. Eisma Chairperson and Administrator of the Subic authority for a term expiring on June 30, 2022. Eisma’s new appointment was made under Executive Order (EO) No. 42, which was signed by the President also on Sept. 25, 2017.

The new EO expressly repealed EO No. 340 signed in 2004 by then President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, which essentially split the powers and duties of the highest position in the Subic Agency. Section 3 of EO 42 provides for the appointment by the President of “the Administrator of the SBMA, who shall be the ex-official Chairman of the SBMA Board.” Eisma, a lawyer and former SBMA volunteer, was appointed SBMA administrator in December 2016, two months after Malacañang named former Volunteers Against Crime and Corruption (VACC) official Martin Diño as chairman of

the Subic Agency. However, the two officials had been at odds since May this year following Diño’s issuance of an administrative order that interfered and encroached upon the duties of the administrator, as well as on the oversight functions of the SBMA Board of Directors Diño had similarly quarreled with another SBMA official whom Malacañang designated as OIC-Administrator before Eisma took over.

This conflict sparked an investigation by the House of Representative on EO 340, with the lawmakers pointing out that the SBMA Administrator was originally the sole appointee under RA 7227. Last month, in a hearing conducted by the House Committee on Bases Conversion, Deputy Executive Secretary for Legal Affairs Menardo Guevarra said they have recommended to President Duterte the repeal of EO 340 to ease the tension in SBMA, hence the issuance of EO 42.

The new EO also noted that EO 340 “has created confusion with regard to the scope of authority, powers, functions and duties of the Chairman of the SBMA Board and the Administrator of the SBMA that has adversely affected the operations of the SBMA, as well as the numerous investors and locators” in the Subic Bay Freeport.

We would also like to thank Chairman Diño for his valiant efforts and for the assistance he gave the locators during the his few months in office. We are confident that Mr. Diño is more than capable of handling the next government position that the President will assign to him.

Moving forward, the locators of Subic Bay expect many great things from Atty. Eisma which is both a compliment and a heavy burden on her shoulders. Being the Chamber and the voice of the business community of course, we are here to support her endeavors that will improve the business environment of Subic and within the same breadth, we are also here to that her leadership and policies will be fair to all the stakeholders of the Subic Bay Freeport Zone.”

SUBIC BAY FREEPORT—A two-day environment summit was held here this past week to conclude the International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) campaign in Zambales and consolidate community efforts in protecting the marine environment in the province. Zed Avecilla, ICC Zambales area coordinator, said activities for the summit was scheduled for September 28 and 29 simultaneously at the Ayala Malls Harbor Point Mall and the International School of Sustainable Tourism in the Subic Bay Freeport Zone. “The ICCPH Environmental Summit is all about lifting the levels of awareness and inspiring more people to come together and build a legacy of a healthy planet for future generations,” said Avecilla, who is also deputy chief of staff for marine environmental protection of the 111th Squadron of the Philippine Coast Guard Auxiliary.

“Although many people helped clean our beaches last week, there is still a lot of work to be done and beach cleanup is not enough,” he said. “We need to strengthen our connection with our environment and realize it is under threat due to indiscriminate human activities and behavior, and an inadequate understanding of its consequences.”

Avecilla explained the environment summit would be part of the Maritime and Archipelagic Nation Awareness Month celebration, which aims to enhance the awareness and consciousness of Filipinos on the important features and concerns of the Philippines as a maritime and archipelagic domain. Avecilla said the speakers during the summit included several young and passionate environmental social entrepreneurs, and experts on waste management and leadership. The two-day event also featured the screening of two award-winning independent films, *Nick and Chai* and *High Tide* in partnership with Active Vista, a human-rights education group that seeks to empower audiences in bringing about relevant social change. Both films tackle contemporary environmental issues. The environmental summit was organized by the Subic Bay Freeport Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the Philippine Coast Guard Auxiliary 111th Squadron, Subic Bay Metropolitan Authority, The Lighthouse Marina Resort Legacy Foundation, National Solid Waste Management Council of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, and the National Coast Watch Council Secretariat.

Avecilla said the event partners wanted to make the call for everybody to take action to conserve the Earth and be responsible citizens of the land. In September 16 thousands of volunteers in Zambales took part in the global coastal cleanup in response to the call to help protect the marine environment. Partial results from municipal ICC coordinators in Zambales indicated at least 71,000 participants from eight of the 13 municipalities in the province, with the capital town of Iba registering the biggest delegation at 20,700. Avecilla said coordinators from five more towns have yet to submit their lists. The ICC Day is held every third Saturday of September, as declared by Presidential Proclamation 470 signed in 2003 to enjoy in Filipinos to observe the global coastal cleanup celebration.

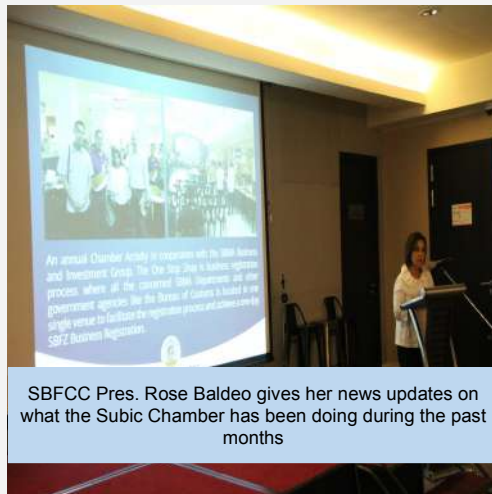
